Cambridge Academic Services delivers ongoing academic support to help students achieve their full potential.

We do this by implementing the College Preparation Language and Culture (CPLC) program and personalized tutoring program for international students. CPLC is a required supplement to The Cambridge Network exchange program and it is also available to international students outside the Network upon request.



College Prep Language and Culture (CPLC) Online Program

Program Overview

The College Prep Language and Culture (CPLC) online program is an English as a second language based program that combines courses covering language skills, high school readiness, cultural skills, online test preparation, and writing workshops. It is an innovative program designed by international educators with content and assessments based on ACTFL World Language Readiness Standards.

The program is customized to the student's current high school grade, so 9th and 10th graders focus more on mastery of language, writing, and comprehension skills while students in 11th and 12th grades focus on reading and comprehension with college-preparatory work and college admissions test preparation. The program runs throughout the school year after school hours and is comprised of up to three hours of instruction per week, and also includes up to three 30-minute individual advising sessions with a Cambridge Network instructor. In addition, students may also take advantage of SAT, ACT, TOEFL test preparation courses as well as writing workshops and college counseling webinars.

The program is offered online through a live and interactive interface, and can be accessed via any standard, internet-connected device and in any location. Students benefit from interactive tools that enhance the learning experience, and get recordings of lessons to replay later.

Benefits

- Students enhance their English skills in speech, writing, listening, and reading comprehension, with a focus on the area that each student most needs to improve.
- Students are better able to integrate with their schools, and better prepared for both high school and college in the U.S.
- Students have greater opportunity for success in both academic and social activities.

Advanced Courses

For students who have a higher degree of English proficiency, these advanced class options allow them to build upon their skills:

- **Advanced Academic English**

The course explores themes in Sociology, Art History, Anthropology, Science and Political Science, and how those themes relate to the greater world. This course helps students strengthen their reading, writing, speaking, listening, grammar, and critical thinking skills.

- **College Advance**

Students in grades 11 and 12 who have advanced English proficiency may opt to take the College Advance course. This college-style course has students view video lectures and read content prior to participating in live, group, on-line sessions with the instructor. Students develop college-level skills, particularly in the areas of essay writing, critical analysis, and independent research.

College Prep Language and Culture (CPLC) Online Program Details and Schedule

Key Program Information

- The programs are each comprised of a total of three hours per week, after school.
- All programs feature live online teaching.
- Students receive up to three additional one-on-one advising sessions.
- Students and parents receive regular progress reports.
- Programs are based on grade level, with opportunities for advanced courses depending on the student's abilities.

9th Grade

Focus: High School Readiness


